

This is a sample of the story board layout for the Reading Fair. Students do not have to necessarily follow this exact layout -- depending on how they decorate their boards, but it gives an idea of the layout. For example, they might want several illustrations around their board, or decorations. The more colorful and creative, the better. The writing should be neat and well-written. Make sure that your project contains ALL of the story elements listed below. Be creative and have fun!!!
